March 1 – 31 Digital billboard advertising is on several of the large digital billboards around the City of Regina letting everyone know that we are celebrating.

March 22 – 29 The flags of Greece will be flown on the Albert Street Bridge in commemoration of the Greek Revolution.

March 21 – 28 is Greek Week in Regina. Many of the businesses in Regina and area owned by Greeks will be celebrating and many will be offering special promotions during that week. March 25th

- City of Regina Proclamation by Mayor Sandra Masters proclaiming March 25th, 2021 as the 200th Anniversary of the Greek War of Independence.
- Flag Raising at City Hall, 10:00 am Mayor Sandra Masters, Warren Steinley, MP, and the leaders of Regina's Greek Community will raise the flag of Greece in front of Regina City Hall. Please note, that due to current restrictions, only 10 people can be within the vicinity of the flagpole where the ceremony will take place. If you do want to be there, you must stand at a distance (across the street, in your car while parked on the street, etc.) and only together with those in your immediate household. The good news is that we plan to stream this event live on our Facebook page so you can watch from the comfort of your home. It will also be available for you to watch later.
- The children of our Greek School will also be celebrating even though it will not be in the usual way due to the current restrictions. They have prepared a display to commemorate the celebration of the Greek Revolution of 1821. Pictures have been posted on Facebook and on the church website.

 The Greek School students will be reciting poems which will be pre-recorded and posted to our Facebook page for all to see.

March 27 Flag Raising at the Legislative Building 2:00 pm

• Laura Ross, MLA, Minister of Parks, Culture and Sport, Michael Kram, MP, and the leaders of Regina's Greek Community of Regina will raise the flag of Greece in front of the Legislature. Please note, that due to current restrictions, only 10 people can be within the vicinity of the flagpole where the ceremony will take place. If you do want to be there, you must stand at a distance (across the street, in your car while parked on the street, etc.) and only together with those in your immediate household. The good news is that we plan to stream this event live on our Facebook page so you can watch from the comfort of your home. It will also be available for you to watch later.

March 28

- Orthros, Divine Liturgy and Doxology for the 25th of March The church service will conclude with the laying of wreaths from the leaders of our Greek Community and the singing of the national anthem of Greece. This service will be live streamed on Facebook for all to see.
- Special screening of "Cliffs of Freedom" Sunday, March 28th 1 pm and 7 pm. The film is a story
 of an ill-fated romance between a young and beautiful Greek village girl and a conflicted Turkish
 officer during the dawn of the Greek War of Independence against the Ottoman Empire in 1821.

There will be two screenings on Sunday March 28th at **Cineplex Cinemas Southland Mall on at 1:00 pm and 7:00 pm.** Seating is limited to 30 people per screening. The movie is rated "R" (18yrs and up).
